

Walter L. Arnstein is Chairman of the Department of History at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He has published *The Bradlaugh Case:* A Study in Late Victorian Opinion and Politics, also Britain Yesterday and Today. He is currently working on a study of mid-Victorian Protestant-Catholic rivalry.

John W. Auld is an Associate Professor of History at California State College, Dominguez Hills. He is engaged in research on Thomas Burt and "Lib-Lab" politics.

Robert C. Braddock is an Assistant Professor of History at Saginaw Valley College, Michigan, and has published an article entitled "The Character and Composition of the Duke of Northumberland's Army." He is currently preparing a study of the early years of Mary Tudor's reign.
