Professor Emeritus Rudolf Bultmann is one of the most notable theological teachers of our time. As a pioneer of Form Criticism, he stands in close relation to the Existentialists, especially to Martin Heidegger. His Gifford Lectures, *History and Eschatology*, offer his interpretation of history. He reveals an affinity between his own thought and that of R. G. Collingwood. Professor Bultmann was Professor of New Testament and Early Christian History at Marburg for thirty years.
