#### COURSE IN LARYNGOLOGY AND BRONCHOESOPHAGOLOGY

THE Department of Otolaryngology, Abraham Lincoln School of Medicine of the University of Illinois and the Eye and Ear Infirmary of the University of Illinois Hospital, will conduct a continuing education course in Laryngology and Bronchoesophagology 18 to 23 March 1974. The course is limited to twenty physicians and will be under the direction of Paul H. Holinger, M.D. It will be held largely at the Eye and Ear Infirmary, 1855 West Taylor Street, Chicago, and will include visits to a number of other Chicago hospitals. Instruction will be provided by means of animal demonstrations and practice in bronchoscopy and esophagoscopy, diagnostic and surgical clinics, as well as didactic lectures.

#### CLINICAL AUDIOLOGY COURSE, MARCH 1974

A FURTHER non-residential Course in Clinical Audiology will be given by the Operational Acoustics and Audiology Group of the Institute of Sound and Vibration Research during the period 25 to 29 March 1974. #### TEMPORAL BONE SURGICAL DISSECTION COURSE

THE Los Angeles Foundation of Otology announces a two-week Temporal Bone Surgical Dissection Course demonstrating the multiple approaches to the structures of the temporal bone as currently used by members of the Otologic Medical Group, Inc.

The course members will be divided each day to observe televised surgery that will correlate with the dissections of the day. Evenings will be devoted to lectures and motion picture demonstrations.

The instructors will dissect in the temporal bone laboratory over closed circuit television and each student will be supervised at the various procedures and approaches are performed.

Twenty otolaryngologists and residents will be accepted in each course. Courses will be presented 17 February to 1 March, 17 to 29 March, 7 to 19 April, 11 to 23 August and 13 to 25 October, 1974. The tuition for otolaryngologists is \$1,000 and for residents \$750 in United States currency.
