#### **CONTRIBUTORS**

This special issue on the Netherlands East Indies has been prepared with the collaboration of the East Indies Institute of America, Inc., 15 West 77 Street, New York City, whose activities are described in the Notes and News section of this issue. The articles have all been contributed with one exception, by members of that Institute. Professor Raymond Kennedy of Yale University, who contributes the first article, is the author of the recently published book The Ageless Indies. Dr. Robert Heine-Geldern, who has lectured and written extensively on the archeology, art, and culture of Southeast Asia, is a Research Associate at the American Museum of Natural History. Professor A. Arthur Schiller of the School of Law of Columbia University has long been a student of Roman law, and of the impact of western law upon eastern law, particularly in the Netherlands East Indies. Raden Abdulkadir Widjojoatmodjo, formerly an administrative official in the East Indies is now attached to the Netherlands Information Bureau in New York. Dr. Franz Weidenreich was formerly in Peking China where he carried forward his valuable studies on the "Peking Man." He is now Visiting Scientist at the American Museum of Natural History, New York City. Dr. E. D. Merrill, Director of the Arnold Arboretum at Harvard University is the outstanding specialist in this country on the flora of the islands of the southwest Pacific. Lloyd S. Millegan of the Library of Congress recently spent a year of study in the Far East. Professor Amry Vandenbosch of the University of Kentucky is widely known as an authority on contemporary developments in the Netherlands East Indies.
