# Anglo-American Idealism 1865-1927

An international conference on all aspects of late nineteenth and early twentieth century idealist philosophy will be held from 4th-6th July 1997 at Manchester College, Oxford. Plenary speakers arranged to date include: James Allard (on Bradley), Leslie Armour (on McTaggart), David Holdcroft (on Collingwood), Anthony Quinton (on Green), Timothy Sprigge (on Royce) and Geoffrey Thomas (on Bosanquet). In addition, there will be a series of discussion sessions based on contributed papers, submissions for which are now invited. These papers should be produced on A4 paper, be double-spaced, and be not more than twelve sides in length. It is hoped to be able to publish a selection of the papers after the conference, and submissions will be accepted only on condition that they have not been published elsewhere and they will, if required, be made available for publication in this collection. The initial submission deadline is December 31st 1996.
