
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The Infection Control Practitioner functions as the (nurse) expert in infection control surveillance and prevention for inpatient and outpatient programs, for the clinical staff, and for the emergency & disaster preparedness committee. Additional responsibilities include: development and review of infection control and related policies/procedures; developing programs for collecting & analyzing infection control data; conducting surveillance; investigating clusters & outbreaks; calculating thresholds for surveillance, and preparing control charts.

This position is also responsible for implementing infection control measures by providing direction in isolation procedures, surgical reprocessing, and aseptic technique. Will also collaborate with Admitting for appropriate patient placement; with Engineering on all construction projects; PI projects & initiatives; and with Medical Center Administration to optimize data collection & analysis and to insure requirements of licensing & accrediting bodies are met.

The Infection Control Practitioner will also assess the educational needs of the institution with respect to infection control & safety; develop & deliver education programs for all skill levels within the organization; participates in clinical & non-clinical orientation; orient new infection control staff; and partner with Occupational Health in exposure management and the assessment of, and orientation for, new products.

Requirements for this position include a Bachelor's degree in Nursing (Master's preferred), Certification in Infection Control preferred, and strong working knowledge of infection control policies, procedures and practices.

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
