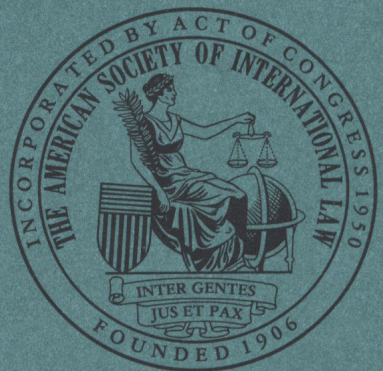

<b>Crimes and Accountability in Shakespeare</b> <i>Theodor Meron</i>	1
<p>Accountability for crimes, a theme central to Shakespeare's canon, retains its pertinence today. Against a background of medieval and Renaissance sources and Shakespeare's environment, this article examines his treatment of crimes committed or ordered by leaders, and such related concepts as command responsibility, superior orders and the defense of duress, frequently drawing modern parallels.
