The trade unions are now seen to be of fundamental importance in our economic system and their role is under critical review.

A clear understanding of the present functions and powers of the unions, their officials and their members is vitally necessary therefore, and the publication of this timely book meets exactly this need. Presenting a fresh view of the subject for the lawyer, the book also provides, for the student of law, business, commerce and politics, a clear summary and explanation of the principles involved.

What, in law, is a trade union? Must the worker join any particular union? To what extent is the union rule-book enforceable in law? What are the powers of union officials and the rights of union members? How are these related to the actual governance of the union, its finances, elections and meetings. All these and other similar matters are dealt with in the first three Parts of the book.

The fourth Part scrutinizes in detail the law on the political activities of trade unions, the establishment of a political fund, the meaning of 'party political objects,' and the various provisions designed to protect the political independence of individual members.

The final Part explains the complex law of strike action. The right to strike, picketing, sympathetic action, unemployment, benefit and the emergency powers of the Government.


