For anyone concerned with the law in West Africa a knowledge of the English common law system, which has been received as the basis of the legal systems in the Gambia, Sierra Leone, Ghana and Nigeria, is an essential requirement. This new book by a lecturer in the University of Ghana is probably the first to describe these limitations, and at the same time provides a valuable survey of the development of English law in West Africa.

Discussing an area which Dr. Farran terms "a microcosm of Africa" where several systems of marriage law operate concurrently—Mohammedan, Christian, Customary and Civil being the most important—this book will appeal not only to practitioners in the Sudan but to all who are interested in the law in Africa.
