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
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
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

Carlisle ink tablets: 1 A, inv. nos 7 and 8 (part). Both 51 mm wide, but photographed at different enlargements. (p. 37)




Carlisle ink tablets: 1 A, inv. no. 9. Width 51 mm. (p. 39)




A. Carlisle ink tablets: 1 A, inv. no. 8 (part). Width 50 mm. (p. 39)



B. Carlisle ink tablets: 1 A, inv. no. 8 (part); right-hand fragment photographed while scanned by infra-red. (p. 39)






Carlisle ink tablets: 1 C, inv. nos 3 and parts of 15 and 16. Width 59 mm.








A. Carlisle ink tablets: 16 (ii). Width 102 mm. (p. 58)










Carlisle ink tablets: 34 front and 34 back (top); 35 (bottom). (p. 71)
















B. Statue of the Mithraic god Arimanius found in York in 1874, now in Yorkshire Museum. (pp. 359-63)






