ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXAMINATION

The examination of the "International Prize Pietro Caliceti" is herewith announced. The prize honours the memory of Prof. Pietro Caliceti, deceased and distinguished Professor of Clinical Otorhinolaryngology of Bologna University.

The prize will be awarded to an Italian or foreign graduate in Medicine and surgery, who during the fouryear period of time (November 1, 1984–October 31, 1988) published a scientific work of unquestionable value and of recognized originaly in the field of otorhinolaryngology.

The prize consists of:

(a) a gold medal, minted form the original mold used by Mrs Ines Misley, the widow of Prof. Caliceti;

(b) a cash-prize of 3.000.000 Lit.;

(c) diploma witnessing the receipt of the prize itself.

On or before December 31, 1988 the competitors must send to the "Ufficio Premi e Borse di studio dell'Università degli Studi di Bologna" the following documents:

(a) an application addressed to the Magnifico Rettore dell'Università degli Studi di Bologna;

(d) a curriculum vitae;

(c) six copies of each scientific work submitted for the examination for the prize (five of these will go to the members of the committee of Judges).

Moreover, the committee of Judges may take into consideration information and data submitted by the above mentioned date from foreign or Italian Universities or from the three Societies of Otorinolaringologia: Italin, Latin, International.
