ASM/SHEA Symposium, "Protecting Workers/Protecting Patients: An Infection Control Dilemma for the 1990's," Convener, Dr. Michael Tapper (Friday morning, May 29).

In addition, there will be one oral session (Wednesday afternoon, May 27) and two poster sessions: "Epidemiologic Typing/Miscellaneous Nosocomial Infections" (Thursday afternoon, May 28) and "Emergence of Resistant Pathogens/Catheter-Related Infections" (Friday afternoon, May 29).

The Division L speaker will be SHEA Past-President Dr. C. Glen Mayhall, who will speak on "Diagnosis of Pneumonia" Wednesday afternoon (May 27) immediately preceding the oral slide session.
