

# Confidential U.S. State Department Central Files CHINA: Internal Affairs, 1930-1949

Covering the internal affairs of China from 1930 through 1949, the State Department's Central Files are the definitive source of American diplomatic reporting on the political, military, social, and economic developments in China. Although scholars have used these files at the National Archives for several years, the files have never been published in any format until now. Additionally, there are reports from the State Department's Division of Far Eastern Affairs, as well as reports on China from such other U.S. diplomatic posts as Tokyo, Saigon, Hanoi, Calcutta, London, Paris, Berlin, and Moscow.

Now available in a convenient microfilm edition, the State Department's Central Files on Chinese internal affairs will be counted among the most useful research collections in any library. Filmed from the original documents in the National Archives, our edition contains all of the important files; only files of little or no historical value (such as those dealing with claims of U.S. citizens) have been omitted. 




