



NEW INSIGHTS FROM THE EAST

THE TOYNBEE-IKEDA DIALOGUE Man Himself Must Choose By Arnold J. Toynbee and Daisaku Ikeda

A rare dialogue between east and west, preserved and transmitted in this truly unique contribution to the history of ideas.

"Before historian Arnold Toynbee died in 1975 at the age of 86, he was joined in London by Japanese intellectual and Buddhist scholar Daisaku Ikeda for a series of discussions on the state of the world today. Their range of topics was extremely broad, including heredity vs. environment, man's abuse of the

environment, population control, medicine and social welfare, suicide and euthanasia, politics, war and recent history. Throughout their dialogue they found themselves more often in agreement than at loggerheads, and they kept returning to the theme of religion.
