2. Large collections of classified photographs for reference and research.
3. Some 12,500 lantern slides covering the whole domain of ancient life and art. Besides the general collection, there are sets of slides with lecture texts.

Both books and slides can be sent to Members by post.

By arrangement with the Society of Antiquaries the quarterly general meetings are normally held in that Society's rooms at Burlington House, Piccadilly, W. 1.

The Journal of Hellenic Studies, recognized at home and abroad as the leading British organ of Greek archaeology, contains articles by first authorities, numerous illustrations and reviews of recent books of importance to classical studies and is at present published yearly as a single volume, which members receive free of charge, the price to the public being two guineas.

The Annual Subscription to the Society is one guinea. The Composition Fee for life-membership is fifteen guineas for persons over fifty years of age and twenty guineas for others. The subscription for Libraries and Student Associates is one guinea and half a guinea respectively. There is no entrance fee.
