The first comprehensive catalogue of African publications details over 6,000 titles from 188 African publishers, research institutions and other organizations with publishing interests in nineteen countries. Of this total, some 1,200 titles represent publications in sixty-eight different African languages. Works are listed alphabetically in author, title and subject sequences. In particular, the subject index, which is arranged by Sears list of subject headings, contains numerous form divisions and cross-references.

Each publication in this series contains the complete set of Annual Reports for the country (and in addition, where they exist, the Blue Books of Statistics and other information on which these Reports were based) from the year of their inception to the year immediately before Independence; and the complete run of the Government Gazette from the date of its first publication to the number immediately prior to Independence, together with Supplements containing legislation, government notices and law reports. The relevant material is surveyed by an Editor appointed by the Publications Committee of the African Studies Association of the United Kingdom who also contributes an introduction to the publication in which attention is drawn to significant items in the collections and their relation to events in the history of the country concerned. Memoirs in print:

J. E. G. Sutton: *The Archaeology of the Western Highlands of Kenya*, B.I.E.A., 1973, £6, paper £3.50.

The first comprehensive account of the variety of later prehistoric sites lying in the highlands of Kenya west of the Great Rift Valley. The author has successfully combined archaeological, ethnographic and linguistic evidence as well as the testimony of oral tradition.

J. S. Kirkman: *Fort Jesus: a Portuguese Fortress on the East African Coast*, Clarendon Press, 1974, £12.50.

Fort Jesus, Mombasa, is the most remarkable historical monument on the coast of Kenya. It was built by the Portuguese in 1593. This book describes the excavations carried out between 1958 and 1971, and has accounts of the Chinese porcelain, Islamic and Portuguese glazed earthenware found there, besides beads, medallions, and cannon.

Neville Chittick: *Kilwa: an Islamic Trading City on the East African Coast*, Vol.1. *History and Archaeology*; Vol.2. *The Finds*. B.I.E.A., 1974, £25 the set.

Kilwa was the main commercial centre on the East African coast before the arrival of the Portuguese at the end of the 16th century. Finds from the excavations lead to a re-examination of the available historical sources, and important modifications to the accepted view of the early history and chronology of the East African coast.
