COURSE FOR POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN

AUDIOLOGY

A FULL-TIME one-year course in Audiology for a Post Graduate Diploma at the University of Melbourne will commence in February, 1976.

The course of instruction in audiology will be conducted at the University of Melbourne in the Department of Otolaryngology and in close association with clinics at the Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital, the Royal Children's Hospital, the National Acoustic Laboratories and the State Health Department, Melbourne.

It will consist of a comprehensive series of lectures, demonstrations, seminars and tutorials on audiology, and the physical and biological sciences associated with it, and will include clinical work in all areas of audiology. Instruction in the basic sciences will cover acoustics, anatomy, biophysics, linguistics, physiology and psychology. Instruction in audiology will cover audiometry, auditory training, communication disorders, general audiology, geriatric audiology, hearing aids, industrial audiology, otolaryngology, paediatric audiology, and parent guidance.
