Membership Recruitment

In the area of local recruitment, Council Member Attorney Lawrence J. Smith of New Orleans launched this past June a personal letter solicitation drive directed to physicians, attorneys, nurses and other health-care deliverers and health-law professionals in greater New Orleans which significantly increased our Louisiana enrollment and promises to lead to the formation of an active local group based in New Orleans . ASLM members who would like to pioneer similar local membership recruitment programs are invited to write to Society Headquarters for help and instructions.

ine in depth the challenging and controversial legal questions and issues raised by the striking recent advances in human genetics. Program speakers have been selected from leading universities and include many national and international authorities in genetics, law, ethics and theology.

This program should appeal not only to physicians interested in genetics, pediatrics, medicine, obstetrics and health-care delivery and lawyers concerned with health, constitutional and criminal law, but also to theologians, philosophers, sociologists, third party payers, hospital administrators, government regulatory agencies and professional liability insurers among others. Details will be announced in future issues of Medicologal News.

Neil L. Chayet, J.D., and John A. Norris, J.D., M.B.A., National Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson respectively have already secured many noted authorities for ASLM's unique First National Conference on the Legal implications of Emergency Medical Care to be held May 21-23, 1975 at the Statler Hilton Hotel in Washington, D.C. The conference will encompass

the legal problems of emergency care on the scene, in ambulance transit and within the hospital. Additional sessions will be directed to model legislation and to the legal aspects of government and other funding of emergency medical care.

Among many of the nation's prestigious medical and legal associations and others who have joined ASLM as Cooperating Cosponsors in this venture are: the American Heart Association, the American College of Legal Medicine, the Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians, the American College of Emergency Physicians, the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, the National Health Lawyers Association, the Center for the Study of Emergency Medical Service at the University of Pennsylvania, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the University Association for Emergency Medical Services, the Employers Insurance of Wausau, the ACT Foundation (Advanced Coronary Treatment) Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Physicians.

The fourth Symposium in the continuing ASLM series of the Medicolegal Evaluation of Disability will be devoted to the medical, legal and insurance approaches to disability evaluation in the field of neuropsychiatry. Forensic Psychiatrist Robert R. Mezer, M.D. and Gerald F. Winkler, M.D., Assistant Clinical Professor of Neurology, Harvard Medical School, are program chairpersons. The program, scheduled for Wednesday November 19, 1975, will include morning presentations by leading authorities in psychlatry and neurology and an afternoon panel discussion and workshop conference focusing on the medical and legal examination of the alleged malingerer.

And in planning stages are a National Conference on Medical Malpractice in conjunction with the Pittsburgh Institute of Legal Medicine, the Duquesne University School of Law and the Pennsylvania Trial Lawyers Association for September or October of 1975 in Pittsburgh; and a two day conference on No Fault Medical Malpractice for the Fall of 1975 in conjunction with the New York Law School in New York City.
