Placement Service Set For Annual Meeting

Eighty-one percent of new Ph.D.s found jobs last year, many with the help of the Annual Meeting Placement Service.

This service allows employers to review the vitae of job applicants and to interview them at the Annual Meeting. Also, applicants can review the list of positions which are open in their respective fields and can apply for positions in which they are interested.

The Placement Service will be open from

September 2-5 and will be held in the Vail and Breckenridge Suites of the Denver Hilton.

To participate in the Service, APSA members are urged to register prior to the opening of the Annual Meeting. Placement registration forms are available in the back of this issue of *PS* and in APSA's *Personnel Placement Newsletter.*

Air Fares Reduced For Denver Convention

APSA has arranged with United Airlines a 30 percent discount off regular roundtrip coach fares to the Association's Annual Meeting in Denver. This substantially reduced rate is available only by calling a special unlisted toll-free number of United's Convention Desk ((800) 521-0810; Michigan residents: (800) 481-0243).

The special convention air fare is available under the following conditions:

• This fare is 30 percent lower than the normal roundtrip coach fare in effect at the time the ticket is purchased.

• Travel must be roundtrip on United only. No minimum stay is required. No en route stopovers are allowed.

• Travel may commence no earlier than August 28 and must be completed on or before September 11, 1982. Reservations for this discounted coach fare must be made and tickets purchased by you or your travel agent at least 30 days in advance of the originating flight.

Anyone wanting to take advantage of this reduced fare to Denver should (1) call the toll-free number: (800) 521-0810 (Michigan residents: (800) 481-0243); (2) ask for the Convention Desk; (3) tell United's Convention Specialists that you are attending the American Political Science Association's Annual Meeting in Denver, or refer to APSA's special convention number: #3218; (4) be aware that the Annual Meeting coincides with the heavily traveled Labor Day weekend and that early reservations will increase the likelihood of obtaining the flight of your choice; (5) have form of payment information (credit card number or check) ready before calling the Convention Desk, and United will mail tickets directly to you.

If the current "air fare war" continues, there may be other discounts available from some originating cities to Denver. Upon request, United will provide travelers with the lowest applicable fare for travel on United.

Super-Savers

In addition to the special arrangements with United, reduced cost travel to Denver may be available through special plans of various airlines, such as the super-saver fare. These plans can be used by those planning to attend the Annual Meeting on an individual basis. Travel agents can assist Denver-bound travelers in obtaining the least costly fare.

Free Child Care Available at Meeting

Child care services will be available without charge to Annual Meeting registrants in Denver from Thursday, September 2, through Sunday, September 5, at the Denver Hilton Hotel.

The hours will be from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. from Thursday through Saturday. On Sunday the service will be available from 8:30 a.m. until noon. Snacks will be available for the children.

Graduate Study Guide Now Available from APSA

The tenth edition of the Guide to Graduate Study in Political Science (1982) is now available from the National Office, according to editor Jean Walen.

The *Guide* describes nearly 300 Ph.D. and M.A. programs in political science. The listing of each program includes information about field specializations, tuition charges, and financial aid, and admission and degree requirements. In addition, the entire faculty of each department with a graduate program in political science is identified along with their fields of specialization, highest degree, and current position.

The purpose of the *Guide* is to provide students and teachers with a concise summary of graduate programs in political science. Students who are interested in a particular field can determine from the lists of faculty and program descriptions which political science departments offer such a specialization, what the requirements for admission to various programs are, and what kinds of financial assistance are available.

The information on which the *Guide* is based was collected in September and October, 1981, directly from political
