This is a symposium by twelve contributors including Professors S. H. Hooke, C. A. Coulson, David Cairns and Herbert Butterfield, and the Very Rev. F. W. Dillistone (Dean of Liverpool), with an Introduction by the Very Rev. W. R. Matthews, D.D. (Dean of St. Paul's) and a Conclusion by the Rev. Nathaniel Micklem, D.D. All have responded to the invitation of the Editor to explain the Christian Faith for the benefit especially of young people, such as those in Sixth Forms and Technical Schools, in one of which the Editor teaches. The subjects include science and religion with special reference to the idea of Creation, the relations of God and man, and the fundamental Christian doctrines regarding Christ, the Holy Spirit, and the Trinity. Theological technicalities are avoided and the successive chapters build up a clear picture of the Christian Faith as it is held by this distinguished group, which includes both laymen and clerics, Free Churchmen and Anglicans.
