## PREFACE

The First International Congress of Twin Studies was conceived as closing the year of the twentieth anniversary of the foundation of the Mendel Institute of Rome - the year which opened whith the Congress of Neurogenetics, 25-28 September 1973. In fact, the Mendel Institute was inaugurated on 6-7 September 1953, and with a Symposium on Twin Studies.

Meanwhile, Acta Geneticae Medicae et Gemellologiae, our international journal which preceded the Institute's foundation, has become twenty-two years old. It is the only journal officially devoted to the study of twins in the field of genetics, and it has served as a stimulus and point of reference to those who have carried forward the research which has eventually led to the present Congress.

The significance of this Congress depends not only on its novelty, but especially on the number and quality of scientific contributions, as shown by the reports listed on the program. The present special issue of our journal contains the abstracts of these contributions, coming from 27 countries and which together constitute a panorama of knowledge at once rich and stimulating.

In presenting it to the members of the Congress and the subscribers to Acta Geneticae Medicae et Gemellologiae, I express the hope that it will be a useful tool for the Congress to leave behind it, and in order to prepare for the future of twin studies. I particularly wish to thank Professor Paolo Parisi, the Secretary General of the Congress and the Acting Editor of the journal, who saw to its preparation and editing.

Acta Geneticae Medicae et Gemellologiae, which is about to come out with two single numbers respectively dedicated to the Proceedings of a Warsaw Symposium on Multiple Pregnancy (1972) and the Rome Neurogenetics Congress (1973), joins the Organizing Committee in wishing the Congress a pleasant stay and fruitful results.
