The subscription rate (excluding VAT) (which includes delivery by air) of volumes 148 and 149 (2010), which includes print and electronic access, is £525 (US \$893 in the USA, Canada and Mexico). Papers in languages other than English should be sent only after prior consultation with the Editor, who may be contacted at <a href="mailto:mpeditor@hermes.cam.ac.uk">mpeditor@hermes.cam.ac.uk</a>. A paper may also be submitted electronically in pdf form together with the TeX file as attachment to an e-mail, i.e. not in the body of the e-mail.
- 3. Correction of proofs. If a paper is accepted, the author will receive in due course page proofs for him to correct and return within one week. To minimize disturbance of type, when words or phrases are added in proof, others of equal length should be removed if possible. If many corrections are made in the proofs, the Council reserves the right to charge the cost.
