Annette Gough is a Fellow and past president (1984-86) of the Australian Association for Environmental Education and a former co-editor of the Association's newsletter *ozEEnews* (1988-90). A Senior Lecturer in the Faculty of Education at Deakin University, she teaches and researches environmental education and science education in pre-service and postgraduate teacher education courses. She is also currently Chair of the Special Interest Group on Ecological and Environmental Education of the American Educational Research Association, and a member of the North American Association for Environmental Education's Commission on Environmental Education Research.

Greg Hunt is the Principal of Victoria's Zoo Education Service, and has a science/zoology background. He works in teaching, curriculum development and professional development. Michael Michie is Principal Education Officer in Science with the NT Department of Education and has worked in secondary schools and field study centres. He is currently series editor of the materials for the Biodiversity and ESD program, a National Professional Development Program for the Australian Association for Environmental Education. His interests include consideration of the effectiveness of excursions and informal learning in science and environmental education.

Judy van Rossem is Program Manager Environmental Education at the Waikato Regional Council in Hamilton, New Zealand. Previously working as an environmental scientist, Judy established the Program through the Council's strategic planning process. She was awarded the 1995 Dame Catherine Tizard Scholarship for her research into the status and needs of environmental education in local government. Judy now plans and coordinates a range of environmental education initiatives across industry, community and school groups and local government. Her specific interests are in natural resource management/landcare education, and in linking environmental education practice to environmental policy.

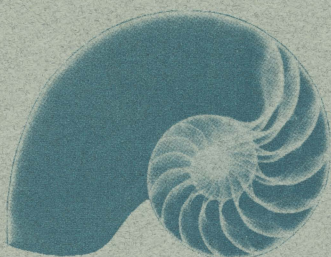
