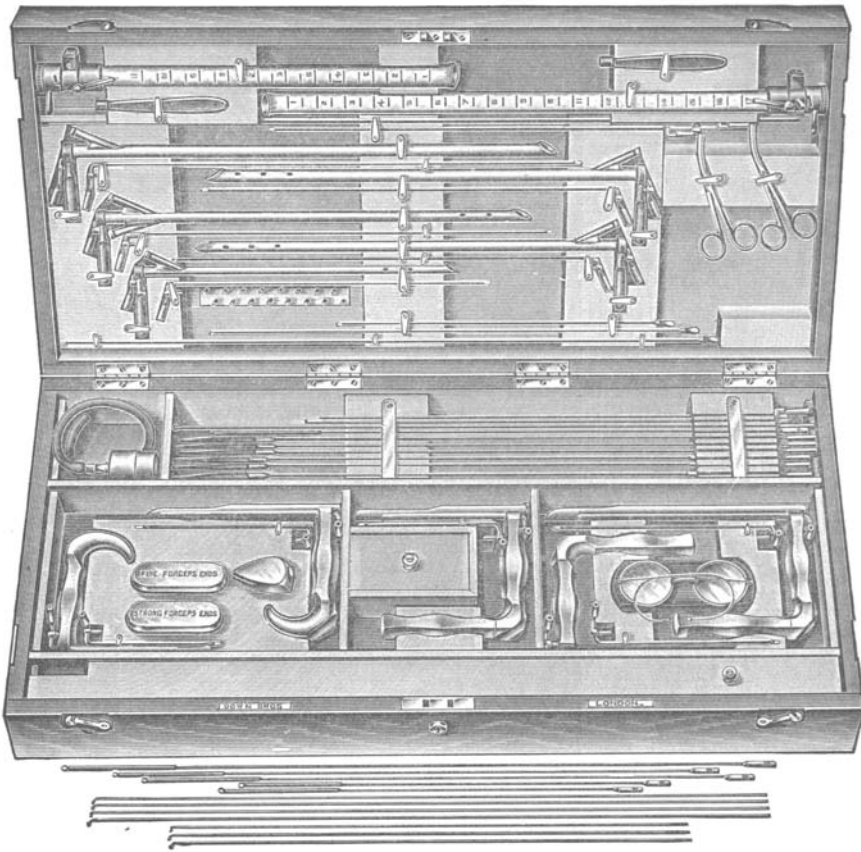

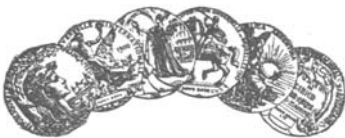

Major operations are performed daily, except Mondays and Saturdays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. 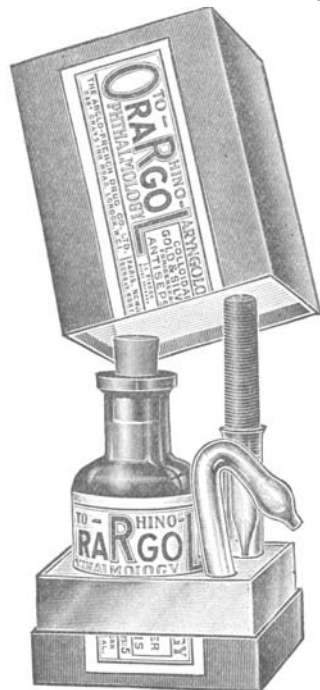
