THE CONTRIBUTORS

W. W. ROSTOW is Professor of Economic History at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he is a member of the Center for International Studies. His most recent publications include *The Dynamics of Soviet Society*, written in collaboration with Alfred Levin (1953), and *The Prospects for Communist China*, with R. W. Hatch, F. A. Kierman, Jr., and Alexander Eckstein (1954).

CHARLES A. MICAUD is an Associate Professor in the Woodrow Wilson Department of Foreign Affairs at the University of Virginia. He is the author of *The French Right and Nazi Germany, 1933-1939* (1943) and a contributor to *Modern France: Problems of the Third and Fourth Republic*, edited by Edward Mead Earle (1951).

JEROME B. COHEN is Associate Professor of Economics at the College of the City of New York. Among his published writings are *Japan's Economy in War and Reconstruction* (1949) and a memorandum prepared in 1952 for the Center of International Studies, Princeton University, entitled "Economic Problems of Free Japan."

WARNER R. SCHILLING is Research Associate in the Institute of War and Peace Studies at Columbia University and Lecturer in Government at Columbia College. He is engaged in a study of the foreign policy premises of American naval policy in World War I and is taking part in the Institute's research project on civil-military relations.

ALLEN S. WHITING has joined the faculty of Michigan State University as Assistant Professor of Political Science after completing a two-year Ford Foundation Fellowship, studying Sino-Soviet relations in Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Japan. He is the author of *Soviet Policies in China, 1917-1924* (1955) and co-author, with Ernst B. Haas, of the forthcoming *Dynamics of International Relations*.

THOMAS C. SCHELLING, Associate Professor of Economics at Yale University, was associated with foreign assistance programs from June 1948 to August 1953 with ECA in Washington, Copenhagen, and Paris, and with the Office of the Director for Mutual Security in Washington. He has subsequently served as a consultant to the Foreign Operations Administration.

WILLIAM G. CARLETON is Professor of Political Science and Chairman of the Social Sciences at the University of Florida. During the past ten years, he has published, here and abroad, well over one hundred articles dealing with domestic politics, international relations, or historical interpretation; his most recent book is *The Revolution in American Foreign Policy* (1954).

ALEXANDER GERSCHENKRON, Professor of Economics at Harvard University, has directed the economics projects at the Russian Research Center since 1949. Among his publications are *Economic Relations with the U.S.S.R.* (1945) and *A Dollar Index of Soviet Machinery Output* (1951).

ALEXANDER ECKSTEIN, Research Associate at the Russian Research Center, Harvard University, was formerly an economist in the Division of Research for the Far East in the State Department. Co-author, with W. W. Rostow, of *Prospects for Communist China* (1954), he has recently published a three-part study of economic conditions in Communist China in *World Politics*.
