CONTRIBUTORS

EMMANUEL AKYEAMPONG is Associate Professor of African History and Hugh K. Foster Associate Professor in African Studies at Harvard University. In 1996 he published *Drink, Power and Social Change: a social history of alcohol in Ghana, c. 1800 to recent times*.

MARY DOUGLAS, a Fellow of University College London, is working collaboratively on a socio-historical study of 'enclaves'. She has held professorships at University College London, Northwestern University and Princeton. The author of *Purity and Danger* (1966) and *Natural Symbols* (1970), she published her monograph on the Lele in 1963.

MICHAEL FLEISHER is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology at Monmouth College in Illinois. His doctoral thesis for the University of Michigan is being revised for publication as *Kuria Cattle Raiders: violence and vigilantism on the Tanzania/Kenya frontier*.

QUENTIN GAUSSET is an Assistant Professor at the Institute of Anthropology, University of Copenhagen. In 1997 he received his doctorate from the Free University of Brussels (where he was a research fellow with the National Fund for Scientific Research, FNRS) for his thesis, 'Les Avatars de l'identité chez les Wawa et les Kwanja du Cameroun'.

SUZETTE HEALD is an Associate Professor at the University of Botswana, on leave from the University of Lancaster. In 1997 she published *Praise Poems of the Kuria*; in 1994 she co-edited (with Ariane Deluz) *Anthropology and Psychoanalysis*. Her study of Gisu violence, *Controlling Anger*, was reissued in 1998, while *Manhood and Morality* is to appear in 1999.

JOK MADUT JOK is an Assistant Professor in the Department of History at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles. After education in the Sudan, Egypt and the United States in 1996 he received his doctorate in anthropology from the University of California, Los Angeles. *Militarization, Gender, and Reproductive Health in South Sudan* was issued in 1998.
