local topics and on local languages, to the study of which he devoted in early days much of his spare time.

C. H. H. Macartney

The Society has lost by death Mr. C. H. H. Macartney, who was a member for fourteen years. He earned the gratitude of Arabic scholars by his elaborate edition of the Odes of Dhu'l-Rummah, an Umayyad poet, famed for the wealth of his vocabulary, but more than ordinarily monotonous. For this edition Mr. Macartney availed himself of practically all existing materials, and his work constitutes a monument of accurate scholarship. To appreciate these odes seems to require not only a great command of the language of the desert, but a very special taste, such as few Europeans possess or acquire.
