A short but profound study which owes much to Teilhard de Chardin. The Church both is, and is becoming, the Christ, because it is his Body. Its reality is found in sacrifice, the nature of which is shown in Calvary and the Eucharist.

The author sets forth succinctly the principles of pastoral counselling, and shows the value and method of this important work.

EPHESIANS: BAPTISM AND PENTECOST

It is argued that the first part of the Epistle is based on a eucharistic prayer, similar in form to a Jewish *berakah*; the second part on a discourse taken from liturgical readings for the feast of Pentecost. Both prayer and discourse contain many references to Baptism; so the Epistle is a valuable source of information about early Christian worship.
