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In 2001 the Canadian Journal of Philosophy received 185 submissions (excluding Critical Notices) and accepted 18, or 9.8% of them.

The journal's procedure for handling submissions is as follows. When a paper arrives at the journal's Lethbridge office, the Administrative Director sends it to an editor selected from the board of nine as having expertise in the paper's subject-matter. This editor reads the paper blind, and decides whether it is worth proceeding with. If the editor does proceed, he or she sends the paper, again blind, to (usually) two referees. Based on the referees' reports, the editor can then recommend the paper to the other editors. If he or she does, the referees' reports, editor's recommendation, and the paper (still blind) go to the editorial board as a whole for a vote.
