ABSTRACTS ON HYGIENE

published originally in 1926 as Bulletin of Hygiene—present title introduced in 1968

The two monthly journals contain abstracts and reviews of articles which appear in the world's leading medical and scientific publications on a broad range of subjects concerned with all aspects of public health, including:

Environmental health—sanitation, water supplies, pollution, toxicology, food hygiene, occupational medicine

Community health—services, health education, maternity, childhood, family health, ageing, nutrition, housing, socio-economic factors, drug abuse Epidemiology and control of diseases.

These abstract journals are complementary in subject coverage, with *Tropical Diseases Bulletin* concentrating on conditions in tropical and subtropical regions and *Abstracts on Hygiene* on those generally affecting communities outside these regions and on matters of universal importance. Notwithstanding the geographical division, *Abstracts on Hygiene* deals mainly with the microbiological aspects of disease, wherever it occurs, while *Tropical Diseases Bulletin* covers medical parasitology and entomology.

Both publications are available in standard and in single-sided editions. The latter version is particularly useful for research workers and other individuals who wish to group abstracts by subject (e.g. by cutting out and pasting on cards) for reference purposes.
