Manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarly quality of books, their contribution to the field, and relevance to other literature. *Albion* does not accept unsolicited book reviews, and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a vita to the editor.
