Affiliates

There is a substantial group of doctors working within the psychiatric service in non-training posts who, for various reasons, cannot take the College's membership examination. Their contribution to psychiatry in these non-career posts is often unrecognised yet they play an essential role in service provision. We estimate there to be approximately 600 in number.

The College has been concerned for many years that this group of doctors is excluded from the College's education activities. Psychiatric practice is changing rapidly and it is essential for these doctors that they participate in the College's education activities.

The College's Bye-laws have therefore been changed to create a new grade to be called Affiliate. (The existing Affiliates will be called Foundation Affiliates.) All Staff Grade Doctors, Clinical Assistants and Clinical Associates, and other such doctors who satisfy the criteria, namely that they should have worked in psychiatry for at least three years, should be invited to join this grade.
