Africa Bibliography (ISSN: 0266-6731) is published as one annual volume in November by Cambridge University Press for the International African Institute. The 2017 subscription price for institutions for *Africa Bibliography 2016* (Works on Africa published during 2016) is £391 (US\$687) for the print volume and one-year’s access to the electronic database. The electronic-only rate is £292 (US\$522) for one year’s access to institutions. **Database access includes access to the current and past volumes of *Africa Bibliography*.** Individuals may purchase the print volume for £75 (US\$145).

Africa Bibliography is also available for sale in a package with the quarterly journal *Africa* (ISSN 0001-9720, E-ISSN 1750-0184).

The 2017 Institutional subscription prices for Volume 87 of *Africa* with *Africa Bibliography* and are £565 (US\$1049) for print plus electronic database access for one year, and £457 (US\$761) for electronic-only access to *Africa* and one year’s access to the *Africa Bibliography* database.

All prices include delivery by air if appropriate, and exclude VAT. EU subscribers (outside the UK) who are not registered for VAT should add VAT at their country’s rate. This authoritative guide to published works in African studies has been published annually since 1984. The *Africa Bibliography* includes a wide range of material: books, articles in journals, and book chapters, covering the whole of Africa. It lists works published in a number of languages, such as Portuguese, Swahili, French and German, as well as English; categorises by region, country and subject; and includes an author index and a detailed thematic index. The *Africa Bibliography* records publications on Africa of interest to students of Africa, principally in the social and environmental sciences, humanities and arts; though some items from the medical, biological and natural sciences, likely to be of interest to a reader from a social science/arts background are included. This annual publication records the previous year's work in its field, with provision for retrospective inclusion of earlier items. It is prepared in association with the International African Institute's journal *Africa*.

T.A. Barringer is a bibliographer who has worked for many years on African and Commonwealth materials.

The *Africa Bibliography* is available as a fully searchable database of all volumes published to date.
