THE CONTRIBUTORS

EDWARD J. WOODHOUSE is a doctoral candidate in political science at Yale University.

ROBERT L. AYRES is Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of California, Berkeley. He is currently engaged in an analysis of the 1970 Chilean presidential election and in a study of the politics of economic policy-making in contemporary Latin America.

MORTON H. HALPERIN is a Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution. He is the author of *Defense Strategies for the Seventies* (1971), among other works. A former Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense, he is currently completing a study of "Bureaucratic Politics and Foreign Policy."

GLEN H. STASSEN is a Research Fellow of the Center for International Affairs at Harvard University and an Associate Professor at Berea College in Kentucky. He is working on a study of cognitive perceptions in foreign policy in the Kennedy administration, particularly in relation to arms control.
