NORTHUMBERLAND AND DURHAM CENTRE

The March and May meetings of the Northumberland and Durham Centre were devoted to discussions involving the relations of philosophy and science. The subject on March 2nd was the philosophy of evolution, and on May 4th the members talked about the concept of matter. In order that the philosophers might not create a science to please themselves, the biologists and physicists of Armstrong College were appealed to for assistance. Professor Meek came to the meeting on March 2nd to explain the present-day position of biology, and on May 4th Mr. Lunnon interested the members of the Group greatly by what he told them of modern conceptions of physics. On both these occasions there was probably more science than philosophy talked, but interest was keen and discussion lively.

At the last meeting on June 1st Miss M. Sturt gave a very entertaining paper on the growth of our knowledge of the external world. She treated the subject psychologically, and disclaimed any attempt to discuss metaphysical questions; but she seemed to lead to the conclusion that everybody had his own internal world, and that the position of subjective idealism was not so very unsatisfactory. This conclusion was startling enough to give rise to a very animated discussion.

The centre will not meet again till October.
