The Journal of Asian Studies, known until September 1956 as the Far Eastern Quarterly, is published by the Association for Asian Studies (formerly The Far Eastern Association) in November, February, May, and August. The annual institutional subscription rate for the Journal (including the Bibliography of Asian Studies) is \$40, postage included. Single issues of the Journal and Bibliography through 1974 are available to non-members for \$10 each; from 1975 to the present single issues of the Journal are \$10 and of the Bibliography are \$20. Orders should be addressed to the Association for Asian Studies Secretariat. Issues published prior to February 1966 may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York 10003.

Membership in the Association for Asian Studies, a scholarly, non-political and non-profit organization, is open to all persons interested in Asia and the scholarly study of Asia. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than 50 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
