

PMLA (ISSN 0030-8129) is published six times a year, in January, March, May, September, October, and November, by the Modern Language Association of America. Membership in the association is open to persons who are professionally interested in the modern languages and literatures. Annual (calendar-year) dues, which include subscription to PMLA, are based on members' incomes and are graduated as follows: student members (seven years maximum), \$20; new regular members (first year), \$35; regular members (income ward), \$25; regular members (income \$15,000-\$20,000), \$40; regular members (income \$20,000-\$30,000), \$55; regular members (income \$40,000-\$40,000), \$65; regular members (income \$40,000-\$50,000), \$75; regular members (income \$50,000-\$60,000), \$85; regular members (income \$60,000-\$70,000), \$95; regular members (income \$70,000-\$80,000), \$105; regular members (income \$80,000-\$100,000), \$125; regular members (income oscillo,000), \$125; regular members (income oscillo,000), \$145; regular members (income oscillo,000), \$14

For libraries and other institutions, an electronic and print subscription for 2007 is \$180, and it includes the electronic and print editions of *Profession*, the MLA's annual journal of opinion about the modern language profession. An institutional subscription including a bound volume at the end of the year is \$350, domestic and foreign. Agents deduct four percent as their fee. Claims for undelivered issues will be honored if they are received within six months of the publication date; thereafter the single-issue price will be charged.
