

The most familiar and powerful of these fictions are analyzed as literature: the stories of Christ's birth, his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, his betraval by Judas, his crucifixion, death, and resurrection. Scholarly yet accessible, this book reveals the Gospels as works of literary art-contrived, creative interpretations of doctrine and literary



precedent that have become the supreme fictions of our culture.


