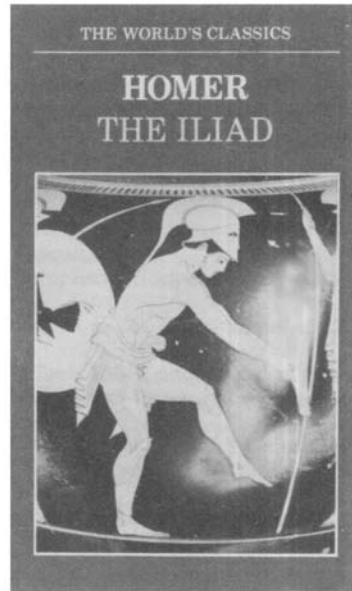

In little more than a century, Roman power and authority spread through the Greek world and irrevocably altered the course of its history. Previous studies of the period have consistently approached the subject from a Roman point of view: this authoritative new study directs its attention to the other side. The altered perspective brings a different picture into focus, showing that Greek traditions and behaviour proved tenacious and that Roman conduct abroad operated largely within categories long established in the Hellenistic world. Gruen suggests that a mutual interaction took place between the two peoples – Rome finding Hellenistic principles congenial and the Greeks manipulating the Roman presence to their advantage.

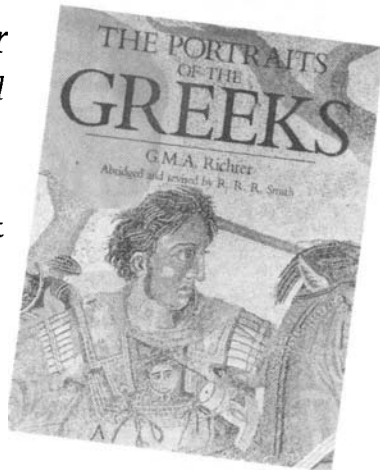

Aristotle and the Stoics
by F. H. SANDBACH

This essay maintains that the extent of influence exerted by Aristotle on the Stoics has often been exaggerated by modern scholars. A collection of all references to him by authors other than Peripatetics, whether contemporary or belonging to the following century, shows that his importance as a philosopher was not then recognised and reveals a lack of evidence that his school-works were known. Professor Sandbach argues that it is a mistake to proceed on the assumption that the Stoics must have known his work, or even an outline of it, and been stimulated, whether to agreement or to modification.

If the supposed evidence for Aristotelian influence is examined without this presumption, much is found to be flimsy and some can be confidently rejected. A residue remains of varying degrees of probability, which it is hard to estimate owing to our insufficient information, particularly about Zeno, about the Academy of his time, about Aristotle's exoteric works, and about memory of him in oral tradition.

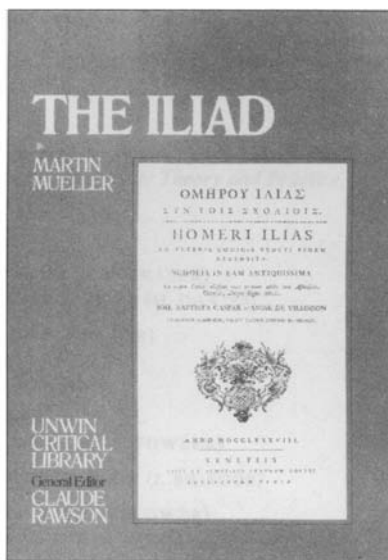
The Iliad
