NORTHERN REGION MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMME

Two new positions are offered due to the expansion of the Mental Health Programme, which serves the Northern Region population of 127,000 based around the town of Launceston.

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The Mental Health Programme is based in the Launceston General Hospital, which, with 385 beds, has a full range of general medical and surgical facilities. The Mental Health Programme Manager is also a practising psychiatrist. The Programme includes acute ward and long-stay residence, rehabilitation service, child and adolescent service and newly established community mental health team. The Programme is part of the Tasmanian Registrar Training Scheme in Psychiatry and has links with the University of Tasmania for teaching medical, nursing and social work students.

The Psychiatrist will join the existing team of four consultants who work with in-patients and out-patients/community patients in the various programme settings. The mix of duties is negotiable according to special interests of the applicant but an interest in community psychiatry would be an advantage.

The 1996 Lancet conference is aimed at a multispecialty response to 'The Challenge of the Dementias: Towards a Better Understanding of Cognitive Impairment'.
