J. MERTON ENGLAND, a member of the history department of the University of Kentucky from 1946 to 1961 and managing editor of the *Journal of Southern History* (1953–58), was on the staff of the National Science Foundation after 1961 and NSF historian from 1972 until his retirement in 1986.
