The second FPS East African tour leaves for Uganda and Kenya on January 28, under the leadership of Sir Hugh Elliott with Leslie Brown of Nairobi.

For June 1967 we have planned our first tour to Iceland and Greenland, and for 1968 there are two tours: our first tour to India in February, which will include the Gir Forest, the Kanha and Corbett National Parks and the famous Kaziranga rhino sanctuary in Assam; and our third tour to East Africa, also in February, which will be in Kenya with the emphasis mainly on birds. These are all in the sterling area. Details are being sent to all members.
