

1. For Institutional Subscribers

If you are connecting from an institution that currently subscribes to the *Journal of the Gilded Age and Progressive Era*, you will automatically receive access to full online content. This is enabled through the use of institutional IP number ranges and does not require your personal login. If your institution subscribes to the paper journal but you find that you cannot access the full-text online version from your campus, please ask your librarian to fill out our Online IP Registration Form, <<u>http://www.historians.org/</u> HistoryCoop/>, which will add your institutional IP numbers to our control system. 2. For Individual Members
