


John Wesley's Theology Today

The once lost Egyptian manuscripts are now believed to have been written by adherents of Gnosticism—a philosphico-religious movement which flourished and which was denounced as blasphemous by the Church in early Christian times. The Gospel of Truth is not a record of the life and teachings of Jesus like the New Testament gospels, but it is a meditation on the good news of salvation which Christ brought and is.
