This is a new and thoroughly revised edition of the book entitled *The African To-day* published in 1934 on the subject of the changing African. It deals with various aspects of the culture change now taking place throughout Africa. Material based to a large extent on information obtained by the research Fellows of the International Institute of African Languages and Cultures has been added to the anthropological sections.

The author during the long periods which he has spent in Africa has, through his knowledge of its languages, been able to obtain a deep insight into the life of the African. He takes the view that European trusteeship of Africa must depend on the knowledge of the native mind and is emphatic in maintaining that the African is fully capable of responding to demands made on him, provided he is given a fair chance.
