Richard and Diane Cummins Legal History Research Grant

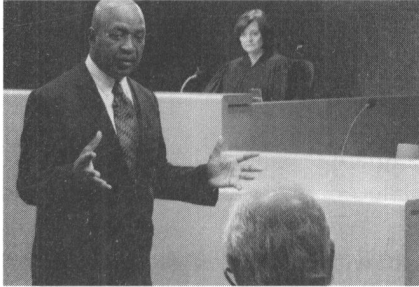

On March 22, 2011, New York Federal District Court Judge Denny Chin rejected a proposed settlement in his lawsuit against Google. The lawsuits were structured so class actions filed by groups representing mainly trade publishers and major publishers. The settlement would have allowed Google to continue scanning copyright books into its e-reader interface and displaying the text to its users in exchange for the payment of license fees to copyright holders.
