## Notes and Announcements:

The VIth European Neuroscience Congress to be held from the 5th to the 10th of September, 1982 at Placio de Congresos, Malaga-Torremolinos, Costa de Sol, Spain will cover a number of topics of interest to neurologists and neuroscientists. Some of these are clinical disorders of language; central cardiovascular control, basic and clinical aspects; mechanism of action of antidepressants; nerve muscle interaction; motor function; and coexistence of peptides and transmitters in single neurons. Technique workshops on monoclonal antibodies and a variety of lectures on Neuroscience topics will also be presented. Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine. While Canada does not appear to have much recognition in terms of Nobel Prizes for work in any of the sciences it is of note that David Hubel who received the award for 1981 was born in Windsor, Ontario and took his early medical training in Montreal. He then moved to the United States and is the George Packer Berry Professor of Physiology at Harvard Medical School, Boston. With Torsten Wiesel his discoveries concerning information processing in the visual system have become widely recognized by those working with the nervous system.

Dr. Melvin Ball, Professor of Neuropathology at the University of Western Ontario, has been granted \$912,882 for a major three year study on dementia, notably Alzheimer's disease, by the National Institutes of Health (U.S. Public Health Service) and \$120,555 for a related two year study by the Ontario Mental Health Foundation. A number of researchers in Canada and the United States are collaborating with Dr. Ball on the investigation. The study will be clinicopathological.

The Motor Neuron Disease Society of Great Britian will be holding a

meeting from July 5th to 7th, 1982 in London, England to which a number of individuals interested in the disorders of the lower motor neuron have, around the world, been invited to discuss possible avenues of study. Motor neuron disease and ALS Societies have now become established in the United States, Canada, Belgium, Great Britian and Japan. At the Vth International Congress on Neuromuscular Diseases from September 21st to 17th, 1982 to be held in Marseille, France there will be an international meeting of members interested in ALS, signifying the active international participation in the study of this disease that is now taking place.

NINCDS Grants to Study Alzheimer's Disease. To those with special interest in dementia the NINCDS and the National Institute of Aging is seeking to support innovative research projects on Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. Areas of particular interest are cerebral circulation and metabolism, neurochemistry, immunology and virology, neuroendocrinology, genetics and epidemiology, animal models and differential diagnosis.
