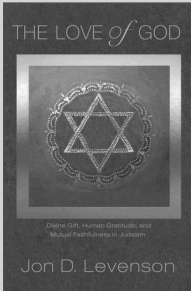

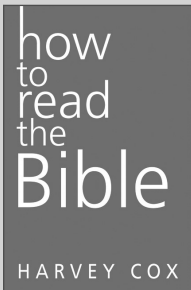


## New Books from Harvard Divinity School Scholars



***The Love of God: Divine Gift, Human Gratitude, and Mutual Faithfulness in Judaism*** by Albert A. List Professor of Jewish Studies Jon D. Levenson (Princeton University Press, November 2015, \$29.95)

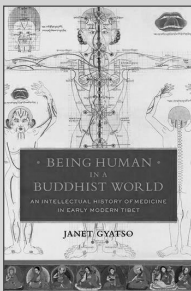
Challenging sentimentalist interpretations of a key but much misunderstood element in Judaism, Jon D. Levenson argues that the love of God is a two-way relationship involving God's mysterious love for the people Israel and the people Israel's loving observance of his commandments, born of their profound gratitude for his acts of deliverance. The book traces the growth and characteristic development of the idea in the biblical, rabbinic, medieval, and modern periods.

Renowned religion expert Harvey Cox deepens our experience of the Bible, revealing the three primary ways we read it, why each is important, and how we can integrate these approaches for a richer understanding of the Old and New Testaments.

*Being Human* critically explores the intersection of early modern sensibilities and religious values in traditional Tibetan medicine. It studies the adaptation of Buddhist concepts and values to medical concerns, suggests important dimensions of Buddhism's role in the development of Asian and global civilization, and traces a strategically astute dialectic between scriptural and empirical authority on questions of history and the nature of human anatomy.

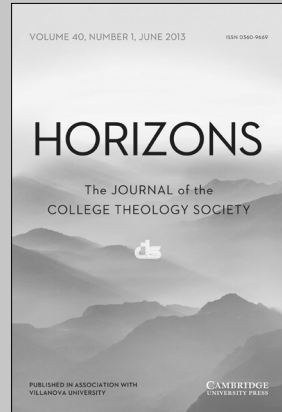

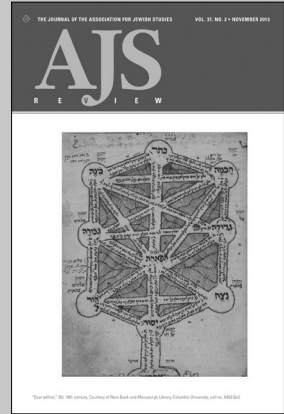

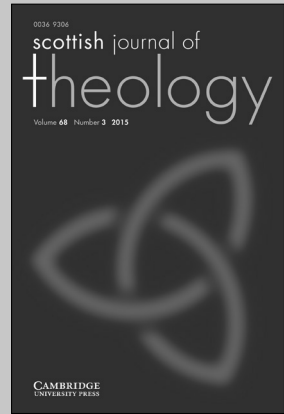
