**Format requirements:** Articles and book reviews should be double-spaced, with double-spaced notes cumulated at the end of the manuscript. AJIL generally conforms to the footnote style of *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation* (15th ed. 1991), published by the Harvard Law Review Association. Authors are invited to indicate whether the manuscript is available on an IBM-compatible diskette. AJIL uses WordPerfect 5.1.

#### PATRONAGE, GIFTS AND BEQUESTS
