In this extensive monograph, the first on slavery throughout the Muscovite period, Hellie discusses Russian slavery as an institution separate from serfdom and compares this system with others. He bases his conclusions on the earliest available Russian demographic information and on a study of a large corpus of laws and court cases. The result is the most comprehensive examination of any of the world's slave systems. In addition, Hellie's use of both narrative and comparative strategies generates a vivid portrait of the life and people of Muscovy.

Manuscripts are sent to referees anonymously and should be prepared accordingly. Library of Congress transliteration should be used. In general, articles should not exceed twenty-five pages. Manuscripts will not be returned unless postage is provided.

The policy of the *Slavic Review* is not to consider materials that have been published or that are being considered for publication elsewhere.

Publication of articles in the *Slavic Review* is ordinarily limited to those submitted by members of the AAASS. Nonmembers wishing to submit manuscripts are asked to request a membership application.
